



> Bloomberg BNA acquires state regulatory data from outside vendors




WHAT BBNA DOES WITH STATE REGULATORY DATA?

Proposed rule of the Department of Public Health amends regulations under AAC 420-3-26-.07 to revise provisions concerning the use of radionuclides in the healing arts to conform to Nuclear Regulatory Commission standards. Onsite Wastewater Board

Final rule of the Onsite Wastewater Board amends regulations under AAC 628-X-2-.07, -3-.03, -3-.04, -3-.06, -4-.01, and -4-.02 regarding board administrative provisions, licensing, and fees. The rule changes the days of submission of rulemaking petitions to coincide with quarterly board meetings, allows municipal utility contractors to obtain a license, removes a grandfathering provision regarding license renewal that has expired, and deletes the annual inspection of a renewing manufacturer. The rule also allows the board to waive late fees for the continuing education deficiency plan, to refund monies to licensees when appropriate, and to charge a bond suspension reinstatement fee. MONITOR CHANGES TO REGULATIONS

.01 Definitions. Definitions.

- A. The following terms have the meanings indicated.
- B. Terms Defined.
- (1) "Application" means the spreading of pesticides, by contract or otherwise, for any person owning or renting property.
- (2) "Alert" means a characteristic change in a dog's behavior in response to the odor of a pest as interpreted by the dog's handler.
- (3) "Canine scent pest detection team" or "Team" means a human and a dog that train and work together as a unit to detect a target pest.
- (2)-(4) "Certified applicator" means a person who is certified by the Secretary under this chapter.
- (3) (5) "Customer" means a person who has entered into a contract with a licensee for pest control and includes the owner of property on which a licensee has applied a pesticide.
- (4)-(6) "Department" means the Maryland Department of Agriculture or its designated representative.
- (5)-(7) "Device" means an instrument or mechanical contrivance intended to trap, locate, destroy, control, repel, or mitigate pests.
- (8) "Distractor" means a non-target odor source placed within a dog's search area.
