- Each publication has its own set of technological tools
- Some technologies are old, others are new
- Partner with Government Publishing Office



Office of the Federal Register

- Office created in 1935
- Federal Register was first publication
- Code of Federal Regulation came soon after
- More publications added over time
- Additional duties
 - Electoral College
 - Constitutional amendments

The Federal Register

- The Federal Register is a daily gazette containing the regulatory activities of the Executive Branch of government
- Available online and in print, it contains:
 - Rules
 - Proposed Rules
 - Notices
 - Presidential Documents
- From the Federal Register, other publications are derived such as the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), FR Index, CFR Index and finding aids.



Document Submission

- Agencies must submit their documents to the OFR for publishing
 - Signed Original
 - Two Certified Copies
 - Electronic copy in Word on disk
 - Disk Certification letter
 - Signed Special Handling letter (as appropriate)
 - OR, submit a PKI-signed document on our Web
 Portal



OFR's use of PKI Signatures

- Federal Register documents require an official signature
- PKI digital signature with a Medium Assurance level PKI certificate issued from a PKI crosscertified to the FPKI
 - Requires the open, international standard PKCS#7 (IETF RFC 2315) digital signature format
- PKI signatures allow the OFR to ensure that published content cannot be challenged on the basis of authenticity



Benefits to Agencies

- Increase efficiency and timeliness
- Saves money (courier, postage, ink, paper, printer maintenance)
- Better for the environment
- Eliminates need for disks, paper, disk certification letters
- Eliminates need to pass through building security




Agency "Pathway" to PKI

- Requires a PKI Certificate:
 - PIV card
 - Certificate purchased from our GPO partner
 - See GPO Circular Letter Nos. 634, 744, 792
 - Other 3rd party solution (that supports PKCS#7)
- Signing Software to apply certificate to documents
 - GSA provides a PKCS#7 Document Signing Tool, developed by the ICAM Lab available on www.idmanagement.gov



Submitting Documents

 Agency Liaisons submit signed documents on our Web Portal:



• Signature information is captured in our document management system





Documents Received

- May 2015
- 2,542 documents
 - 259 Rules
 - 196 Proposed Rules
 - 2,052 Notices
 - 35 Presidential Documents
- 1,294 submitted through the web portal



Documents Published

- May 2015
- 2,480 Documents
 - 254 Rules
 - 190 Proposed Rules
 - 2,000 Notices
 - 36 Presidential Documents
- 62 documents not published in May
- 6,138 FR pages published during May

- 3-day turn around for most documents
- Documents placed on Public Inspection List (PIL) the day before publication

eDOCS

- Document management system
- Based on HighVIEW platform
- Started in 2003
- 2004 managed about 9% of documents
- 2005 managed about 21% of documents
- 2006 managed about 66% of documents
- 2008 managed 100% of documents


- March 2015

Government Publishing Office

- Congressional agency
- OFR is statutorily bound to GPO
- GPO produces print and electronic products
- Hosts most of the publication websites
- Bills for publication fees and subscriptions



Some GPO Technologies

- eXtyles automatic conversion and coding
- MicroComp typesetting
- PDF proofs
- SGML updates
- XML dumps



OK to Print

- OFR reviews text from GPO
- Makes edits and corrections in PDF
- Gives OK to Print



federalregister.gov

- Released in 2010
- Issues back to 1994
- Unofficial content
- Much of the website is automated
- MyFR accounts
- Commenting feature with regulations.gov
- Very useful, but not official yet




FDsys

- Produced by Government Publishing Office
- Free online access to official publications
- All 3 branches of federal government
- OFR publications on FDsys
- Authentic, digitally signed PDF documents



Code of Federal Regulations

- CFR
- Special edition of the Federal Register
- Codification of regulatory text published in the Federal Register as a rule

CFR Updates

- Printed CFR is the official, legal version
- www.fdsys.gov
- SGML updated manually
- All volumes are published once a year, one quarter of the volumes every 3 months

- Title 1 - Title 16 As of January 1

- Title 17 - Title 27 As of April 1

- Title 28 - Title 41 As of July 1

- Title 42 - Title 50 As of October 1

Volumes with no changes are "cover only"



e-CFR

- Electronic Code of Federal Regulations
- Launched February 2001
- Updated daily, two Federal workdays behind the calendar
- Not legal, but is the source for printed, legal edition.
- Effective date driven
- Based on SGML files



e-CFR (Cont.)

- Incorporate amendments effective on Federal Register publication
- Insert links to amendment text that published but not yet effective.
- Incorporate amendments that published in a prior Federal Register with a future effective date.
- Updated by hand



e-CFR Point In Time

- Launched Spring 2015, e-CFR PIT lets you view previous updates to the e-CFR
- Driven by effective date
- Data from January 1, 2015 forward
- Easily accessed from the main e-CFR page
